WHAT IS HIMS?

HIMS is an occupational substance abuse treatment program, specific to pilots, that coordinates the identification, treatment, and return to work process for affected aviators. It is an industry-wide effort in which managers, pilots, healthcare professionals, and the FAA work together to preserve careers and enhance air safety.



The <u>American Medical Association</u> recognized alcohol dependence in 1956. Alcohol dependence fits the disease model because it is a dysfunctional state with characteristic form.



Scene 8 – I Like My Old AME Better

- Let's get to know each other, follow up with me, HIMS AME, monthly until your FAA package is sent in, then quarterly.
- Determine when ready for P & P
- 90 AA meetings in 90 days.
- Set up random drug/alcohol testing
- Go to Group Aftercare weekly
- See Chief/Peer pilot monthly







Scene 9 – Am I Smarter Than a 5th Grader? The Neuropsychological Evaluation

- What is Tested?
 - Aeromedically Relevant Neurocognitive Function
 - Review of Systems, Education, Family, Jobs, etc.
 - Personality Profile
 - Substance Use Indices
- Results to HIMS Psychiatrist & AME
- Prep for Testing Do's & Don'ts
- Impressions NOT Final Determination
- FAA Neuropsychologist Final Determination



Scene 11 – The HIMS Team Meets

- "the meeting after the meeting"
- usually done when the team has valid concerns
- discuss observations as a team
- come up with a plan of action; phone call reach out? Intervention?









Scene 12 – Time to Intervene

- In person is always preferred
- decide ahead of time who who'll be "good cop/bad cop"
- use factual observations and statement, avoid hurt feelings and personalities
- have pilot explain themselves and their perspective
- discuss options with pilot, follow through with outcomes


